The Cathedral's Education Department is selling off resources that were bought for the time the Museum of the Moon was in the Cathedral. These resources are no longer needed and so we hope to recoup some of the money in order to buy new resources for school visits. ALL SAINTS: the Feast of All Saints, the Cathedral's patronal festival, will be celebrated on **Sunday 3rd November** at the Cathedral Eucharist at 10.45am, together with the Feast of the Cathedral's Hallowing. Following the service everyone is invited to King Edmund's Drinks, a festive variation on the usual refreshments. King Edmund I (a grandson of Alfred the Great) founded the church of All Saints on this site in 940.

ALL SOULS: On the evening of **Sunday 3rd November** at 6pm there will be a Sung Eucharist for All Souls, with commemoration of the departed and music from Duruflé's Requiem. Names to be remembered and read out at the All Souls service may be entered on the lists on the noticeboard in the Cathedral

and Bridge Chapel, or passed to Jessica in the Cathedral Office (01332 341201 or jessica@derbycathedral.org)

HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY 2020 commemorates the Holocaust and reflects on genocides which have taken place since then. HMD 2020 marks 75 years since the Liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau. It is also the 25th anniversary of the Genocide in Bosnia, and there will be services to remember these at the Bridge Chapel and Cathedral on **Monday 27th January**. In addition, children are invited to design a poster on this year's theme, 'Stand Together'. For more information, please see the posters at the back, of the Cathedral and at the Bridge Chapel.

CHRISTMAS! Dates for the Carol Services are slightly different this year. The two Cathedral Carol Services will be on **Sunday 22nd December** at 6pm, and on **Tuesday 24th December** at 6pm. The Carol Services will not be ticketed and are open to all. Sing Christmas, a shorter daytime carol service, will be on **Monday 23rd December** at 12.45pm. At 3pm on **Christmas Eve** there will be a carol service for families and younger children - if you are looking for an opportunity to dress up as a shepherd or a star, this is it. The midnight service on **Christmas Eve** will start at 11pm, and services on **Christmas morning** are at the normal Sunday times of 8am, 9.15am and 10.45am.
