- **for worship and prayer**

Details of services this week and next Sunday are on the back of this leaflet. Children are very welcome – details of children’s activities today are in the order of service.

- **for newcomers and visitors**

Welcome! At the 10.45am Cathedral Eucharist on Sunday, look for the welcome stewards in blue sashes, or ask a member of the stewarding team if there’s anything you’d like to know. Talk to the clergy after the service and stay on, if you can, for tea or coffee and a chance to meet other people. Ask a steward for a welcome card if you would like to receive emails about the life and work of the Cathedral.

News and Notices

EPIPHANY and CANDLEMAS: The **Feast of the Epiphany** is celebrated **today** at the 10.45am Cathedral Eucharist, with a procession of gifts remembering the arrival of the wise men to greet Jesus with gold, frankincense and myrrh. The season of Epiphany continues until Sunday 2nd February, the Presentation of Christ in the Temple – usually called **Candlemas**. At Evensong on **2nd February** we will bring our Christmas celebrations to a final close with Benjamin Britten's Ceremony of Carols, sung by the Girl Choristers.

LA NATIVITÉ DU SEIGNEUR is a work for organ by the French composer Olivier Messiaen, nine 'meditations' on the birth of Jesus. You can hear this played – live in Derby Cathedral! – by Alexander Binns **today** at 4pm. Entrance is free, donations are invited, and audience members will receive a voucher for a free hot drink in the Sanctuary café which will be open after the performance.

The **WEDNESDAY GROUP** resumes on **Wednesday 8th January**. The group meets on Wednesday evenings (7pm – 8pm) in The Sanctuary café to read and discuss the Bible readings for the following Sunday. It's a chance to learn more and talk about anything to do with the Christian faith, ask questions, meet people and grow in faith. You can just turn up, or for more information talk to the Acting Dean.

THE JULIAN GROUP is a small ecumenical group, affiliated to the nationwide Julian Meetings, and meets regularly to spend an hour in meditation. All are welcome. VOLUNTEERS' EPIPHANY PARTIES: Cathedral Volunteers are in one of their busiest seasons at the moment – stewarding, serving, welcoming schools, and working behind the scenes for a packed December programme of services and events. But the work of volunteers goes on through the whole year, often in less visible ways, and the Cathedral depends on them to be able to welcome so many visitors and worshippers. There will be two Volunteers' Parties in Epiphany as a way to thank Cathedral volunteers for all their work: on **Tuesday 14th January** at the Canons' Houses, 6pm – 8pm, and on **Sunday 19th January** in the Sanctuary café after the Cathedral Eucharist. Volunteers should receive invitations through their team leaders. If you would be interested in volunteering, speak to one of the Cathedral clergy or Cathedral Wardens.

BE A CHORISTER FOR A DAY: On **Saturday 18th January**, a chance for boys and girls aged 7-13 to discover the opportunities and amazing lifestyle of a Cathedral Chorister. HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY this year, on **Monday 27th January**, falls on the 75th anniversary of the liberation of the camp at Auschwitz-Birkenau. The theme of the day is Stand Together. There will be a Service of Reflection at the Bridge Chapel at 3.00 pm, followed by the setting of stones as an **Act of Commemoration** on Cathedral Green. At 6.00 pm in the Cathedral there is a **Service of Commemoration, Remembrance and Hope**, with the Very Revd Geoffrey Marshall as the preacher. The **PARISH GIVING SCHEME** is a national Church of England scheme enabling you to make regular donations to the Cathedral through direct debit from your bank. It is efficient and saves a lot of time, as the volunteers who open envelopes and count money every week can tell you, and it also gives you the option to update your giving annually by the rate of inflation. Information packs are available in the Cathedral – please ask a steward if you would like to know more.

NEWSLETTER: The format of Outlook (the Cathedral magazine) has changed this month, as the editor steps down: very many thanks go to Stephen Lamont for his long, thoughtful and patient service in this role. The paper Outlook is replaced with a newsletter you can pick up in the Cathedral, and a monthly email newsletter – you can sign up to receive that through the Cathedral website or contact office@derbycathedral.org. Look on the Cathedral website for the Outlook page with talks, sermons, and longer articles – there aren’t many yet but it will grow.
