HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY this year, on **Monday 27th January**, falls on the 75th anniversary of the liberation of the camp at Auschwitz-Birkenau. The theme of the day is Stand Together. There will be a Service of Reflection at the Bridge Chapel at 3.00 pm, followed by the setting of stones as an **Act of Commemoration** on Cathedral Green. At 6.00 pm in the Cathedral there is a **Service of Commemoration, Remembrance and Hope**, with the Very Revd Geoffrey Marshall as the preacher. A **CEREMONY OF CAROLS**: Celebrating the Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple (Candlemas), Evensong on **Sunday 2nd February** at 6.00 pm concludes with Benjamin Britten's twelve-movement masterpiece, sung by

the Girl Choristers of Derby Cathedral, accompanied by Harpist Rowena Bass and directed by Alexander Binns. Entry is free – all are welcome
