The **BISHOP OF REPTON** is moving on from the Diocese of Derby to become Residentiary Canon (House for Duty) at Lichfield Cathedral and Honorary Assistant Bishop in the Diocese of Lichfield. The Rt Revd Jan McFarlane will move to Lichfield with her husband Andrew and take on her new role in April, after almost four years as Bishop of Repton. Bishop Jan will preach at Evensong at Derby Cathedral on **Sunday 8th March** at 6.00 pm and hopes to be able to say a less formal farewell after that service. She will be installed in Lichfield Cathedral at Evensong (5.30 pm) on **Friday 3rd April**. Everyone is welcome to both these services.
