

As part of the **NATIONAL SAFEGUARDING AUDIT** taking place at Derby Cathedral in March, we would like to hear your views on safeguarding, what we do well but also how, in your opinion, we can improve. Today safeguarding questionnaires are available from the Cathedral Stewards. Please complete a questionnaire and either put it in the box or return it to the Cathedral Office. All questionnaires will be treated with the utmost confidence. Questionnaires must be returned by 15th February 2019.

The Social Care Institute for Excellence (SCIE), who will be carrying out the Audit, have asked to meet with a number of Focus Groups to hear a wide range of views regarding safeguarding. If you are interested in being part of a Focus Group, add your contact details on the questionnaire in order for us to discuss this further.

**THE MOTHERS UNION** meet in the Beddoes Room from 10.15am on Tuesday 12th February, beginning with coffee at 10.15 am. The theme for the year is 'Listen, Observe, Act: in step with God'. The speaker is the Revd Catherine Hollywell, on 'God as our Compass: Getting Lost and finding our Way Home'. All are welcome.

**FRANCISCAN EUCHARIST** at 7.30 pm on 12th February in the Bridge Chapel, celebrating Jacoba of Settesoli. Refreshments afterwards will include biscuits made to her renowned recipe – as given to the dying St Francis. A discussion will follow on 'A Franciscan way of working in and for the Community' and the evening will finish by 9.30pm after Compline. Everyone is welcome to come to part or all of the evening.

**DONATIONS** from congregational giving were allocated as follows at the January meeting of the Cathedral JPICC group (Justice, Peace and the Integrity of Creation): • £300 to the Toilet Twinning project to fund 5 toilets – look out for the certificates in the Cathedral Centre loos! • £300 to the Traidcraft Exchange project to support local artisans whose previous funding has been withdrawn. • £300 for Practical Action for farmers in Zimbabwe to get solar water pumps in a drought-stricken region. • £300 for Medical Aid for Palestine for hospitals and medical support in crisis in Gaza. Surplus donations for tea and coffee after services from January to June 2019 will go to the Centre. Thanks to everyone whose giving has made these donations possible, and to JPICC for their careful stewardship.
