**THANK YOU** to everyone who helped to welcome unprecedented numbers of visitors to the Cathedral during the Museum of the Moon. Thank you also for your patience with frustrated people who couldn't get in and your adaptability and patience as the numbers grew and grew. Over **69 THOUSAND** people visited over three weeks – it was wonderful to see them being welcomed, being amazed by the Moon, and then discovering the whole Cathedral, lighting candles, and putting a (very healthy!) contribution in the donations boxes. **HIGH SHERIFF'S LEGAL SERVICE** The High Sheriff of Derbyshire is the Sovereign's representative in the county for all matters related to the legal system. The annual service, this year held **today** at 3pm, is an opportunity to give thanks and pray for the life of the community and especially for all those involved in bringing law, order and justice to the county of Derbyshire. All are welcome.

**HOMELESS SUNDAY** will be marked today at Choral Evensong at 6pm, with representatives from charities and groups working with homeless people locally. After Evensong, from 7pm – 7.30pm, there will be a candlelit vigil around the Knife Angel remembering people who have suffered from street violence.

**NATIONAL MONUMENT AGAINST VIOLENCE AND AGGRESSION:** the Knife Angel is here! The Angel is 27 feet tall and weighs just over one tonne. It will stand outside the Cathedral until the end of October. The Knife Angel will be a focus for many events on the theme of crime prevention, including a Youth Forum, and there will be a Cathedral service remembering victims of violence on **Sunday 20th October** at 3pm.

*Please note that while the Knife Angel is on site, no parking will be possible outside the west end of the Cathedral.*
