The Cathedral Choir comprises girl and boy Choristers (who sing separately) and six professional Lay Clerks. As well as singing the regular routine of weekly services at the Cathedral, the Choir has made numerous recordings and appearances on national radio, as well as tours abroad to France and Belgium. All our choristers receive a world-class musical education, including free one-to-one singing lessons and music theory lessons. Boys begin in the Cathedral Choir as early as school year 3 and continue until their voices change (around school year 8). Girls can begin from school year 3 and continue until they leave school in year 13. More information about becoming a Chorister at the Cathedral can be found on our website. The Voluntary Choir is a chamber ensemble who meet most Friday evenings, and sing some of the Sunday services and special feasts throughout the year when the Cathedral Choir is unavailable. It performs a wide range of sacred music, from the renaissance polyphony of William Byrd, to works by living composers written specifically for the choir. As well as supporting the musical worship at the Cathedral, the Choir also performs in other locations around the diocese and country, and appears regularly on local radio.
