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The Cathedral Choir

Over the past few years, **Derby Cathedral Choir** has built a national reputation for **excellence**, and within the East Midlands is one of the only professional ensembles of its kind. Comprising Boy and Girl Choristers, Junior Choral Scholars, and a team of Lay Clerks (adult professional singers), the Cathedral Choir sings at least **five choral services** each week on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday. Our Choristers are drawn from around 20 different schools across Derby and the surrounding area.

The Cathedral Choir has an extensive **repertoire** spanning from medieval plainsong to newly-commissioned works. On top of the singing of services, the Cathedral Choir regularly performs **concerts**, often in collaboration with Sinfonia Viva, the professional orchestra for the East Midlands. In recent years, we have also performed in concerts in partnership with **Gabrieli** and **The Sixteen**. Broadcasts and tours are a regular part of the Cathedral Choir's schedule, with recent **tours** including Germany and London, where we sang at St Paul's Cathedral, Trinity College Cambridge and with the Chapel Royal Choir at Hampton Court Palace. We are also part of the East Midlands **Four Choirs' Festival**, singing Evensong annually with the choirs of Southwell Minster, Coventry Cathedral and Leicester Cathedral.



Music at Derby Cathedral

Derby Cathedral has one of the most **rapidly-expanding** Cathedral Music Departments in the UK. Alongside the Cathedral Choir, the Cathedral has a **Voluntary Choir** for adults who sing when the Cathedral Choir is not in residence and a **Junior Choir** for pre-chorister aged children. **Small Sounds**, our early years music group also meets every week.

Our **Music in Schools Programme** currently works with 1400 children in 25 schools each week, bringing children a **high-quality** music education through whole-class singing sessions, school choirs, and one-to-one **piano and organ tuition**. Our Music in Schools Programme has just launched a new choir, **Treble Makers**, at a church in our Diocese.

Deputy Lay Clerks

The successful candidates would join a pool of Alto, Tenor or Bass Deputy Lay Clerks to cover services when one of our regular **Lay Clerks** is unavailable, or on such occasions as extra singers are needed. We are also seeking **Soprano Deputy Lay Clerks** to sing for midweek funerals or occasional services.

Deputy Lay Clerks are engaged on a **self-employed** basis and are paid by the service at the end of each month on receipt of an **invoice**.

Remuneration

Our current fees are:

£35.65 per **statutory** service (regular Evensong or Sunday Eucharist)

£78 per **special** service (Weddings, Funerals etc.)



Safeguarding

At Derby Cathedral we take safeguarding very seriously and it is **central** to Chapter's care for the life and work of the Cathedral. Safeguarding means the action we take to promote a **safe and healthy culture** for everyone connected to the Cathedral. The Cathedral's safeguarding policies are available on the website.

Successful applicants will be recruited in line with Church of England **Safer Recruitment Policy** and will be required to complete a **Confidential Declaration form**. Deputy Lay Clerks who sing six or more services or concerts in a term will be required to complete a **DBS clearance** and complete Church of England **Basic Safeguarding Training**.

Main Duties of Deputy Lay Clerks

- To sing Alto, Tenor or Bass with the Cathedral Choir for services, concerts, broadcasts, tours or any other event as required OR to sing Soprano with the Lay Clerks for services
- To prepare all music to the highest standards in advance of rehearsals
- On occasion, to be willing to undertake solo work as required
- To ensure that any safeguarding training is undertaken, and to pass on any safeguarding concerns without delay



Responsibilities of all our team

- As the Cathedral is run by a small team, all staff and contractors are expected to act flexibly and cover for each other when required
- You could be asked to undertake as requested other duties as might reasonably be expected
- To follow the policies and procedures of the Cathedral, paying particular attention to the requirements of the policies and procedures for the safeguarding of vulnerable adults and children
- To treat everyone with respect and dignity in the workplace

Interview and selection process

Please submit your application using the application form and provide a **personal statement** (max. 1000 words). Applications should be received by email to alexander@derbycathedral.org **at any time**. Once the application form has been received, should we wish to invite you to interview and audition, you will be required to prepare a solo piece and undertake several passages of sightreading. The solo piece could be an aria from an oratorio or passion, a song or an extended solo section from a choral work. You will also be asked some questions about safeguarding. This position is offered subject to two satisfactory references and the completion of a Confidential Declaration Form.
