A reading from the book of Genesis.

Jacob got up, took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. He took them and sent them across the stream, and likewise everything that he had. Jacob was left alone; and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. 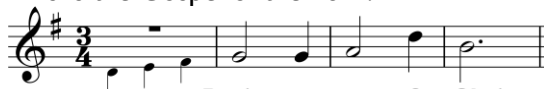


Glo-ry to you, O Lord.

Jesus said to them, 'They need not go away; you give them something to eat.' They replied, 'We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish.' And he said, 'Bring them here to me.' Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. The president continues

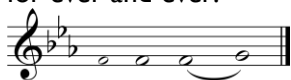
And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross,

Remember that Christ died for you.
Feed on him now in your heart by faith with thanksgiving.
**O most merciful redeemer,
friend and brother,
may I know you more clearly,
love you more dearly,
and follow you more nearly,
day by day. Amen.**

Please come forward to receive Communion at the altar rail as directed by the stewards.

Baptised members of all Christian churches are welcome to receive communion. Others who are not communicants are warmly invited to come to the altar for a blessing. Simply come and kneel at the rail and keep your head bowed. Communicants are free to decide whether they wish to receive from the chalice or not. If you decide not to receive from the chalice, Communion is nevertheless received in full with just the host (wafer). Please note that dipping the wafer in the chalice is not permitted.
